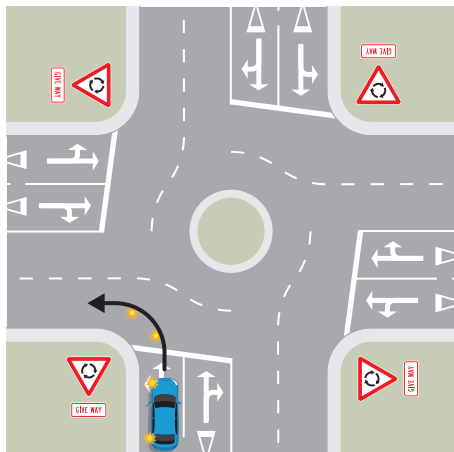


Know your way around roundabouts

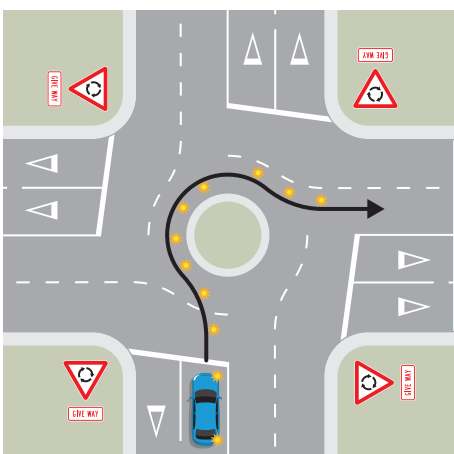
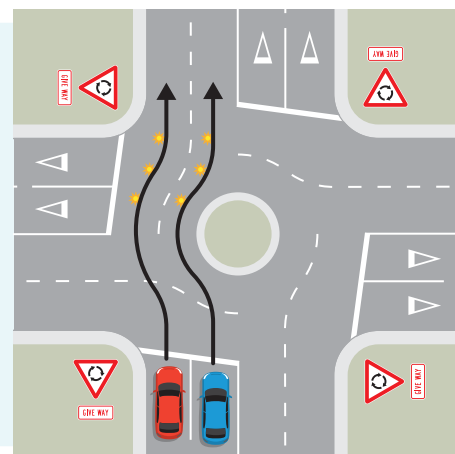


If you're turning left at the first exit:

- slow down as you come up to the roundabout
- be prepared to give way
- use the left-hand lane, or any lane with a left arrow
- **signal left** for 3 seconds as you come up to the roundabout
- give way to all vehicles coming from your right
- **keep indicating left** until you've exited the roundabout.

If you're going straight through:

- slow down as you come up to the roundabout
- be prepared to give way
- use a lane with a straight arrow
- **don't signal** as you come up to the roundabout
- give way to all vehicles coming from your right
- **signal left** as you pass the exit **before** the one you'll take.



If you're going more than halfway around:

- slow down as you come up to the roundabout
- be prepared to give way
- use the right-hand lane, or any lane with a right arrow
- **signal right** for 3 seconds as you come up to the roundabout
- give way to all vehicles coming from your right
- **keep signalling right** as you go around the roundabout
- then **signal left** as you pass the exit **before** the one you'll take.

Remember to look out for:

- cyclists, who may find it hard to keep signalling on a roundabout
- vehicles that may have to change lanes to exit
- vehicles that may not be able to stay in their lane because they're large (like a bus) or travelling too fast.
